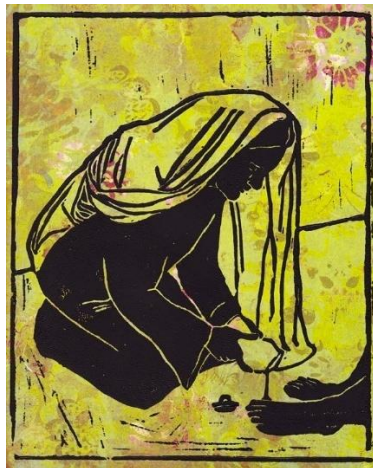


Welcome!
